Discussion on Prostitution Law Reform to Highlight Civil Liberties Group's AGM

Professor John Lowman of Simon Fraser University's School of Criminology is set to headline the B.C. Civil Liberties Association's Annual General Meeting this Wednesday evening, March 28 at 7:30 pm at the YWCA (535 Hornby St, Vancouver)

Professor Lowman is a recognized expert on the sex trade in Canada and the need for reform of the law that criminalizes and regulates Canada's "oldest profession".
